She doesn't like to drive that far in her little Geo if she has to do all the driving, and she has wanted to make several short trips to monitor her mother's condition rather than a longer summer vacation trip. We are presently planning to drive to the 1996 family reunion in New Brunswick (and Nova Scotia) however, and would like to see you on the way. It will probably be some time in July.
