Police Hemmed: No One Jailed

At least 63 protesters and 13 lawmen were injured Wednesday on the Bascom Hill heart of the University of Wisconsin campus where an anti-war sit-in demonstration raged to rioting.

No one was jailed during the afternoon mob action.

"We were too woefully outnumbered to make arrests," Police Chief Wilbur H. Emery said.


