Dear Wesley. Thank you for your letter of Nov. 4th.

It is interesting that you are now set up in a garage repair business of your own after your many adventures in far places. I am sending this letter to your business place and hope it reaches you O.K.

You have shown enthusiasm and initiative in your social credit crusade by getting your name on the ballot in Norfolk as the social credit candidate. Perhaps you will even find a girl friend who shares your enthusiasm for the cause.

I am enclosing a write up of our trip to Europe this last summer which I thought you and the family might be interested in. I am also enclosing an article which some of you might like to read. It is one of about 65 articles which I have had published.

Yes, I did have in mind offering the grave space in my cemetery plot in Tillsburg to your parents. I have hesitated to do so because I thought they might already have a plot of their own in Delhi or at least prefer to be buried in the town where they have lived so long. Now I understand that your father doesn't want to be buried in Delhi because it has been so taken over by tobacco farmers. Please find out for me if they would like to use the grave spaces in my plot in Tillsburg. They are welcome to

them if they want them. There are only two spaces left and they are at the extreme edges of the plot with the other graves in between. There is space on the ~~back~~^{back of the} memorial stone for both their names along with Winnifred's.

I am sure you understand that since we have moved to the United States we have all become United States citizens and have very few ties left in Canada. Evelyn and I are as permanently employed as one can be, and satisfied to spend the rest of our lives in Minneapolis. We expect to be buried together here eventually and will have no use for the grave spaces still remaining in Tillsonburg.

If your mother and father would like to be buried there where it will be somewhat removed from Delhi and yet near enough for all of you to visit.

The cemetery plot has perpetual care paid for so it will never be neglected. If they want to use it, I will write to the cemetery authority and authorize the use of it.

Please let us know how your father & mother are. We haven't had any news recently.
